Grade 4 Literacy - Singular and Plural Nouns – A singular noun names one person, place, or thing. Examples – woman, river, tree. A plural noun names more than one person, place, or thing. Plural nouns often end in s or es. Nouns that end in y are irregular. In this case, the y is changed to I and we add es. Words that end in ey are changed by adding an s. Some words do not change when written in the plural form. Words ending in x will end in es in the plural form.
